Job Description

The On Location Coordinator will be responsible for creating and maintaining relationships with organizations in our community. Originally conceived of as a year long series of satellite studios, to ensure the safety of all involved, the On Location Coordinator will find ways to work in the community using remote tools when necessary. The On Location Coordinator will be responsible for reaching out to and setting up partnerships with community organizations with the goal of getting more voices and community issues on the airwaves. They will take the lead in creating engaging community focused content for our morning show Morning Mixtape.

- Hold a degree or diploma in Journalism, Communications or Arts from an accredited academic or technical institution OR have equivalent experience in broadcast, community organizing, or the no-profit sector
- Strong people skills: You are a great listener
- Strong skills in both a team setting and with independent work
- Experience in a supervisory position

- Familiarity with audio and video editing editing (Audition/Pro tools/Premiere or comparable programs). Familiarity with shoutcast or icecast or other simulcast programs is an asset
- Volunteer or paid experience in a not-for-profit environment
- A passion for local arts and experience with local arts organizations
- High level written communication skills
- Archival knowledge and experience is an asset
- Outgoing, friendly and reliable
- Social media savvy.
